Lesson

Summary: Jesus was approached by a rich young man asking "What shall I do to inherit eternal life?" He told Jesus that he had kept all of the commandments from his youth. Jesus lovingly told him that there was only one thing he lacked, he should sell all that he had and follow Him. The proud young man was sorrowful, and went away.

Jesus asks all of us to come and follow Him. We can do this by keeping His commandments. Sometimes, like the rich young man, we may be prompted to do something to be better. Let us put our trust in God and try to follow Jesus Christ a little better each day.

Points toWhat trapped the rich young man who claimed that he had obeyed all the commandments fromPonder:his youth? (Discuss ideas.)

"Jesus said unto him, If thou wilt be perfect, go and sell that thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come and follow me. But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful: for he had great possessions." (Matt. 19:21–22)

What would you do if Jesus asked you to follow Him? (Discuss ideas.)

"And he said to them all, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me." (Luke 9:23)

What was the young man giving up for wealth? (Discuss ideas.)

"Tragically, millions in the world today still prize and choose 'the riches of the earth' over the 'riches of eternity' (D&C 38:39), not knowing or fully understanding that 'he that hath eternal life is rich' (D&C 6:7), and that eternal life is God's greatest gift to man (see D&C 14:7)." *John M. What is this great treasure in heaven-eternal life? (Discuss ideas.)

"Because of the Savior, we will live forever. Immortality means that we will never die, but eternal life means to live forever in exalted spheres in companionship with those we cherish, encompassed about by profound love, exquisite joy, and glory. ... How can we follow the admonition to "Come, follow me"? (Discuss ideas.)

"Jesus both taught and exemplified many personal qualities which we should consider as we try to follow Him. These qualities include love, meekness, humility, compassion, thirsting after righteous - ness, being prayerful, merciful, and pure in heart. ... He especially cautioned us to lay up treasures in heaven rather than treasures on earth. (See Matt. 5–7.) The admonition to 'Come, follow me' and the question 'What would Jesus do?' provide powerful guidelines for living–paying more attention to these guidelines will help all of us become more Christlike in our thoughts and actions." *William W. What does it mean to follow Jesus? (Discuss ideas.)

Following Jesus Christ means being willing to do what He has asked us to do. "If ye love me, keep my commandments." (John 14:15). We follow Him when we choose the right and follow His example in everything we do.

What are some of the things that might trap us today and keep us from following the Savior? (Discuss ideas.)

"It can be our work, our hobbies, our pleasures, and, above all else, our temptations and sins. In short, anything that pulls us away from our relationship with our Heavenly Father or from His restored Church. Let me give you a modern example: A computer can be a useful and indispensable tool, but if we allow it to devour our time with vain, unproductive, and sometimes destructive pursuits, it becomes an entangling net." *Joseph B. 



What you need:	A copy of "Treasure in Heaven" activity (artwork included with this lesson), scissors, glue, tape and laminating sheets or cardstock.
Preparation	 Print out the artwork. Laminate artwork or glue to cardstock. Cut along dotted lines. Fold along solid lines. Glue in place and secure with tape to form chest and lid. Place lid on chest by inserting hinges on lid into slits on back of chest. Tape to secure. Make necklaces by making a hole in top of jewel with a paper punch. Thread a length of yarn through holes and tie a knot in the end. Make rings and bracelets by taping
	 the bands to back of jewels. 7. Place jewels in treasure chest and footsteps on floor leading to treasure chest. 8. Write down three situations for each child in which they could follow Jesus. Example: Mother asked you to pick up your toys before going out to play, but your friend won't wait for you. What will you do to follow Jesus?
Activity:	 (Younger children will need help from an older sibling or parent.) 1. Read: "Then Jesus beholding him loved him, and said unto him, One thing thou lackest: go thy way, sell whatsoever thou hast, and give to the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, take up the cross, and follow me." (Mark 10:21) 2. Ask: What does it mean to follow Jesus? (Discuss ideas.)
	 3. Ask: Why is life better for us when we follow Jesus? (Discuss ideas.) 4. Ask: Why does Jesus want to follow Use? (Decrease He Jesus and want to some we all.)
	 4. Ask: Why does Jesus want us to follow Him? (Because He loves and wants to save us all.) 5. Have each child answer the questions you have prepared for them. Have child step on a set of footprints after answering each question. When they reach the last set of footprints let them choose something out of the treasure chest. 6. Ask: What is the treasure in Heaven that we can have if we follow Jesus?
	 (Eternal Life.) 7. Bear testimony that if we follow Jesus, He will lead us back to live with our Heavenly Father again.






Peanut Butter Footsteps

Cookie Dough

cup butter
 cup brown sugar
 cup granulated sugar
 eggs
 2/3 cup peanut butter
 tsp. vanilla
 cups flour
 tsp. baking soda
 1/2 tsp. salt
 cups rolled oats

Peanut Butter Frosting

1/4 cup peanut butter1 Tbs. butter3/4 cup powdered sugar2-4 Tbs. milk.

Chocolate Frosting 1 Tbs. butter 1/8 cup unsweetened cocoa powder 3/4 cup powdered sugar 2-4 Tbs milk.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Cream together butter, brown sugar and granulated sugar. Add eggs, peanut butter & vanilla. Mix until smooth. Add flour, baking soda, salt, and oats. Mix until blended. Roll dough on lightly floured surface to 1/4-1/2 inch thickness. Cut out with foot-shaped cookie cutter. Bake on lightly greased cookie sheet for 10-15 minutes.

Optional: Remove from oven and immediately cover each cookie with (8) chocolate chips. Allow chips to melt, then spread evenly over cookie. Cool in refrigerator until chips harden (this will be the sole). Frost other side of cookie with Peanut Butter Frosting.

Treat Time: Help children decorate cookies with chocolate frosting to look like sandals Jesus might have worn.
