





## Shining Celebration

Jewish families still celebrate Hanukkah by lighting the menorah, a special lamp with holders for nine candles. Eight of the candles represent the eight days that the oil burned in the rededicated temple, and the ninth candle is used to light the others. It is called the shammash. One candle is added each of the eight days of Hanukkah to remind families of their religious history.

Three of the dreidels below are exactly alike. Look at each dreidel carefully and color only the three that are exactly alike.



### **HOLIDAY&TREAT**

#### LATKES: HANUKKAH POTATO CAKES

Today, Hanukkah is celebrated by Jewish families with many traditions such as lighting the menorah. There is no special feast for Hanukkah, but there is much merriness and gift-giving. A favorite treat is latkes (LOT-kuhs) which are similar to potato pancakes.

You can use the recipe below to make your own latkes (you'll need some help from an adult). Try dipping your latkes in apple-sauce or sour cream!

#### What you'll need:

- ☆ 2 cups grated potatoes

- ↑ 1 teaspoon baking powder

- 1. Mix together the potato, onion, and salt.
- 2. Mix just the flour and baking powder together, then add to the potato mixture.
- 3. Add the beaten egg to the potato mixture.
- 4. Heat oil in a skillet and drop small piles of potato mixture (2 tablespoons) into skillet. Press the potato piles flat with a spatula.
- 5. Fry for 2 minutes on each side or until brown.
- 6. Let the latkes cool slightly on a paper towel before serving.



- 6. The Jews didn't want an idol in their temple because God had declared that His people should have "no other gods" before Him.
- 7. Antiochus claimed to be Zeus.
- 8. The Jews would not worship the Greek gods and the Greek king.
- 9. The Greeks had spears, shields, catapults, elephants, and horses.
- 10. The greatest weapon was the mountain itself.
- 11. The Jews created secret weapons such as a dammed-up pond and retaining walls holding back timbers and rocks that could be released on the enemy below.
- 12. They restored the temple and destroyed the idol.
- 13. The problem was that there was very little pure oil available only enough to burn for one day.
- 14. The oil lasted long enough to burn for eight days.
- 15. They celebrate to commemorate the rededication of the temple and the miracle of the oil that burned for eight days.



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
