



Activity Time

Approximate time: 10 minutes

What you need: A copy of the “Trust in God” T.V. screen and film roll (artwork included with this lesson), scissors, poster board or card stock, tape and glue.

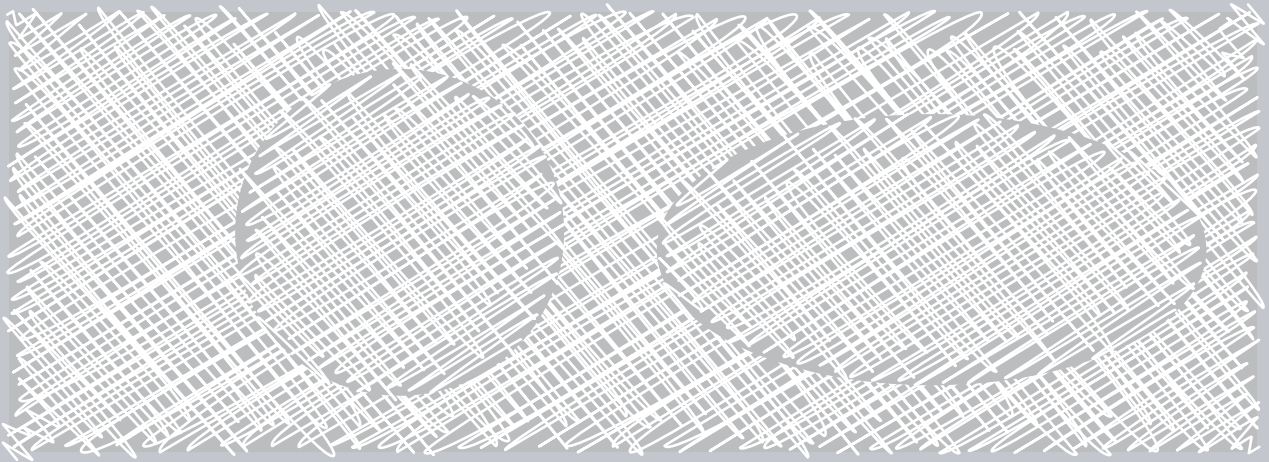
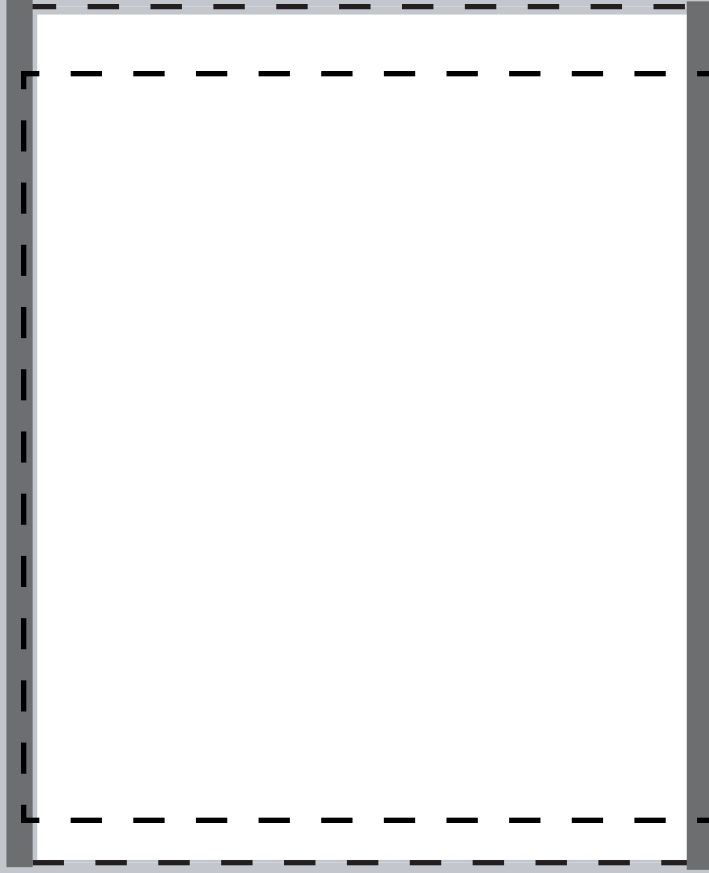
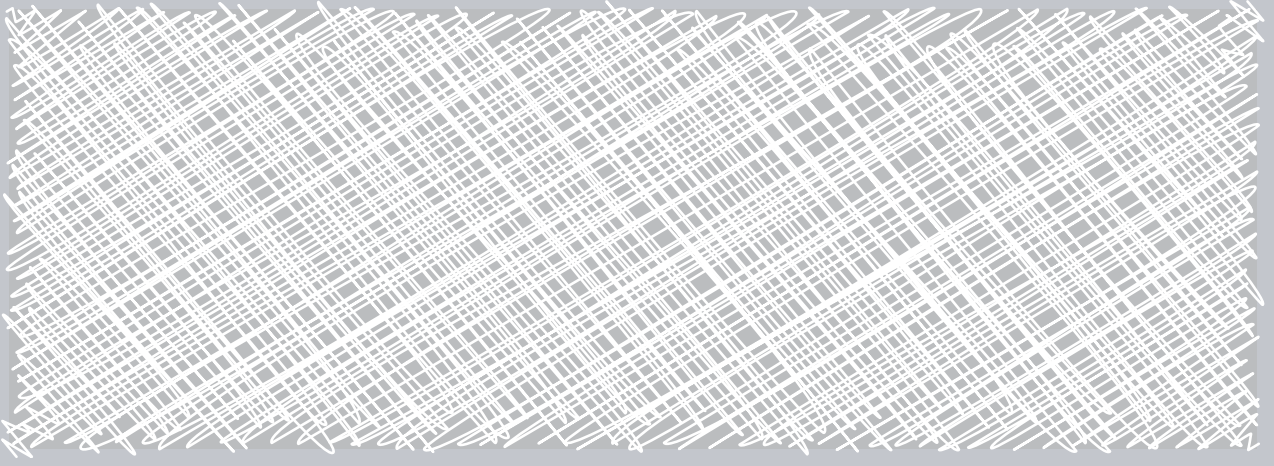
Preparation

1. **Print** out the artwork.
2. **Cut** out.
3. **T.V. screen:**
 - A. Glue onto poster board.
 - B. Cut along dotted lines.
4. **Film roll:**
 - A. Fold along dotted lines and glue or tape together.
 - B. Glue or tape a picture of your children where indicated.
 - C. Glue or tape the sections together by matching up letters.



Activity:

1. Roll up movie roll.
2. Insert the start of the movie roll into the viewer slots as shown in picture.
2. Read the scripture and talk about how it applies to your family.
3. Read the dialogue on the back of the movie roll as you pull it through the viewer.
4. Discuss each situation with your family (if desired come up with situation of your own that you feel fit your family needs better).
5. When the answer to the situation is no, discuss what you should do differently in order to answer 'yes'.
6. Emphasize how always following these important principles will help us learn to always trust in God, no matter what.

Were you being faithful like Daniel?

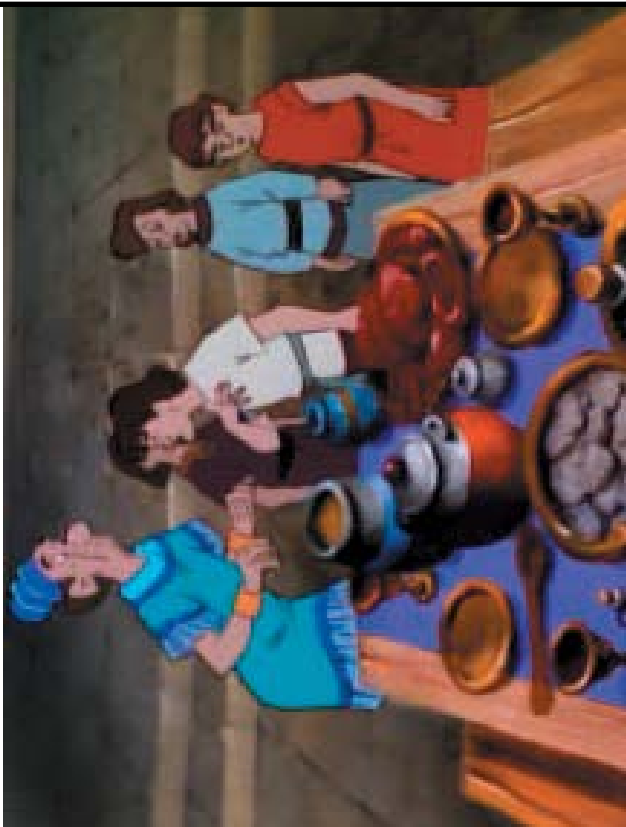


A
