Lesson Summary:

As Moroni finishes the record, he includes letters from his father, Mormon. These letters teach us many things about the nature of Jesus Christ and how we should follow Him. Mormon explains how to judge good from evil and he encourages us to cling to that which is good. Mormon teaches about the light of Christ, which is given to every man to help them to know good from evil. Good things invite us to do good and believe in Jesus Christ. He again reminds us that we must have faith, hope, and charity. Charity is the pure love of Christ.

In his letters, Mormon teaches us that little children don't need to be baptized until they are old enough to be accountable. He also teaches us a lot about the nature of God and Jesus Christ. God is unchangeable and impartial. He loves all of His children and He is merciful.

In Mormon's final letter in the Book of Mormon, he records his feelings about the terrible destruction of the Nephites. Although he is sad, he encourages his son Moroni to be faithful and look to Jesus Christ for peace. We can always find peace in lesus Christ.

Activity Time

Fill Your Heart With Love

Description: Make a heart shaped pocket and fill it with ways you can show love and have

charity for others. Throughout the month, draw from the pocket and perform the

acts of service you chose.

What you need:

A copy of the heart artwork, a sheet of paper, scissors, pens or pencils, and a

stapler, tape, or glue

Preparation: 1. Print and cut out the artwork. Cut the sheet of paper into strips.

2. Staple the hearts together around the edges to form a pocket, leaving the top

open.

Activity:

Explain: In Moroni [] Mormon explains that charity is the pure love of Christ. Charity is

kind, selfless, patient, pure, and true. Jesus was all of these things.

Discuss with your family: What things can we do for others that can help us be like


Jesus? Who can we do them for?

Activity: Write your ideas on the strips of paper. Fill the heart pocket with your completed strips of paper. Use the strips of paper daily throughout the month to show love and charity for others. You might want to start right away by choosing one for your family to do together, or have each family member choose their own idea from the

pocket.







Treat TimeHeart Treats

Prep Time: 15 minutes **Cooling Time:** 10 minutes

Ingredients: 3 T butter

6 oz marshmallows (1/2 bag)

dash of salt 1 tsp. vanilla

3 cups crisp rice cereal Sprinkles (optional)

Instructions:

Lightly coat a sheet of wax paper with cooking spray and set aside. Lightly coat a heart shaped cookie cutter with cooking spray also and set aside. Melt butter in a large saucepan. Add marshmallows and a dash of salt and stir until marshmallows are melted. Remove from heat and stir in vanilla. Add cereal and stir until coated. Drop a large spoonful of cereal mixture on the prepared wax paper and place the cookie cutter around it. Firmly press cereal mixture into cookie cutter to shape into a heart. Remove any excess. Continue with remaining cereal mixture. Makes 6-8 hearts depending on size of cookie cutter.

Treat Time: Let children decorate hearts with sprinkles if desired.
