# Activity Time

Description:	Play this game (similar to Go Fish) to collect all 4 cards of each Article of Faith.	
What you need:	A copy of the "Articles of Faith Card Game", cardstock, scissors.	
Preparation:	<ol> <li>Print out the cards on heavy paper or cardstock, or print on standard paper and mount to cardstock.</li> <li>Cut apart cards and shuffle.</li> </ol>	
Activity:	Object of the game: Win the most sets of four cards (Articles of Faith) by asking other players for them.	
	To play: Deal five cards to each person. Leave the undealt cards face down as the draw pile. Starting with the player at the dealer's left, each player asks another for cards of an Article of Faith. For example: "Kevin, do you have any 6s?" In order to ask, you must already have at least one 6. Kevin has to give you all the 6s he holds, but the other players do not.	
	Whenever your request for a card is filled, it remains your turn. Continue your turn, asking any player for cards of a specific A of F. When the player you ask doesn't have the requested card, you'll be told to "Take a Card." Pick up the top card of the draw pile. if it's the A of F you called for, show the card and your turn goes on. If not, your turn ends. Play proceeds to the left.	
	Whenever you have collected all four cards of one Article of Faith, show the other players, then place the set next to you face up. Help the player put the cards in order, and read the Article of Faith. Talk about what it means.	
	If a player runs out of cards, they must draw 5 from the draw pile. If the draw pile is empty, the game ends and the player with the most sets of four cards wins.
