Scripture: Exodus 3:10-12

"Come now therefore, and I will send thee unto Pharaoh, that thou mayest bring forth my people the children of Israel out of Egypt. And Moses said unto God, Who am I, that I should go unto Pharaoh, and that I should bring forth the children of Israel out of Egypt? And he said, Certainly I will be with thee; and this shall be a token unto thee, that I have sent thee: When thou hast brought forth the people out of Egypt, ye shall serve God upon this mountain"

Lesson Summary:

The Israelites (also known as Hebrews) lived in Egypt for many years, but a new pharaoh that didn't know Joseph enslaved them. The pharaoh didn't want the Hebrew people to become too great so he declared that every baby boy should be killed. One Hebrew woman hid her son for three months. When she could no longer hide him, she put him in a basket and put the basket in the river. The pharaoh's daughter found the basket and had compassion on him. She raised the boy as her son and called him Moses.

One day when Moses was grown, he saw an Egyptian beating a Hebrew slave. Moses grew angry and killed the Egyptian. Moses knew he would be punished so he ran away to the land of Midian. There he met the family of Jethro and they took care of him. Moses went to the mountain as he was tending Jethro's sheep. The Lord appeared to him as a burning bush and told him to take off his shoes because it was a holy place. Moses learned from the Lord that he was a son of God and that he would help the Lord deliver his people from the Egyptians. Moses was hesitant. He didn't think he could speak well enough to convince the people to follow him. The Lord promised to help him. He gave Moses power to perform miracles to convince the people to follow him. The Lord also called Aaron, Moses's brother, to speak for him. Moses and Aaron went to the pharaoh and asked him to let the people go.

Questions: How was Moses' life saved when he was a baby?

Why did the Lord tell Moses to remove his shoes? How can we show reverence for sacred places?

How did the Lord help Moses prepare for his mission?

Description:

Use this Burning Bush activity to review the story of Moses and his calling from the Lord to help deliver the children of Israel from Egypt.

What you need:

■ A copy of the "Burning Bush" activity, scissors, scriptures, tape.

Preparation:

Print out the artwork. Cut out. Tape the four sections of the bush together by overlapping edges to match.


Activity:

(Younger children will need help from an older sibling or parent.)

- 1. Ask: How did the Lord appear to Moses? ("In a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush" [Ex. 3:2])
- 2. Ask: What was the first thing the Lord said to Moses? (He called him by name. "Moses, Moses." [Exodus 3:4])
- 3. Read this quote: "Through this experience Moses learned of his relationship to God and heard the words 'Behold, thou art my son." (Moses 1:4) Imagine the shock and amazement that Moses, this man raised in the pagan' environment of Pharaoh's court, must have experienced when he learned from God Himself that he was a son of God." Richard C. Edgley
- 4. Ask: Do you think the Lord knows your name? (Discuss ideas. Emphasize that the Lord knows and loves each of His children. [John 10:3])
- 5. Explain: When the Lord told Moses that he was to go to Egypt and free the children of Israel, Moses expressed his feelings of inadequacy. He told the Lord that he was "slow of speech..." [Ex. 4:10]
- 6. Ask: How did the Lord respond to Moses' fears? (Discuss ideas. See Ex. 4:11-16)
- 7. Explain: Like Moses, the Lord loves us and will be with us to help us accomplish the things that He calls us to do.
- 8. (Show bush illustration without flames.) Ask: What is missing from this "burning bush"? (Flames.)
- 9. Take turns answering questions. Tape a flame on the bush for each question answered correctly



Treat Time

No Bake Burning Bush Cookies

Prep Time: 3 minutes Bake Time: 2 minutes

Ingredients: 1/2 cup milk

2 cups sugar

1 cube butter or margarine 1/4 cup baking cocoa

1 t. vanilla

3 cups chow mein noodles

1 cup candy corn



Instructions:

Combine milk, sugar, butter and cocoa in medium sauce pan. Cook on medium until mixture boils; stirring continually. Continue stirring while mixture boils for two minutes. Remove from heat. Add vanilla. Stir in chow mein noodles until completely covered with chocolate mixture. Drop tablespoonsful of the mixture onto large sheet of wax paper to form chocolate bushes.

Treat Time: Give each family member a chocolate bush. Press leaf flames (candy corn) onto your bushes to create your Burning Bush cookie.
