## Learning from Isaiah

### Lesson Summary:

Isaiah was a prophet. He prophesied about things that would happen in his day, in the life of Christ, in the latter days, and during the Millennium after the Second Coming of Jesus Christ. Isaiah warned his people to "cease to do evil" and "learn to do well" (Isaiah 1:16-17) and taught them that through repentance their sins could be made "white as snow" (Isaiah 1:18). Isaiah prophesied of the birth and life of Jesus Christ, saying, "Behold a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel," (Isaiah 7:14) and "For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given... and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:6) Isaiah prophesied of the scattering of Israel and of the gathering of Israel in the latter days, and that the "Lord's house shall be established in the top of the mountains... and all nations shall flow unto it." (Isaiah 2:2)

In 3 Nephi 23:1, Jesus Christ told the Nephites to "search these things diligently; for great are the words of Isaiah." Although Isaiah's writings are sometimes difficult to understand, we can learn a lot the Lord and His people from Isaiah's words.

# Words of Isaiah Matching Game

■ A copy of "Words of Isaiah Matching Game", scissors, heavy or colored paper, glue.


### Preparation:


- 1. Print the "Words of Isaiah Matching Game" cards.
- 2. If they are easily seen through, glue a sheet of heavy or colored paper to the back before cutting.
- 3. Cut apart cards.

### **Activity:**

Lay out all of the cards face down. Take turns choosing two cards. If the cards don't match, that person's turn is over and the next person takes a turn to choose two cards. If the cards do match, read the scripture on the card and talk about what you learn. Remove the cards from the playing area. The turn then ends and another person takes a turn to choose two cards.

Continue playing until all of the matches are found.

# "White as Snow" Candy

Prep Time: 3 minutes Cook Time: 4 minutes

**Ingredients:** 3-ounces regular cream cheese (softened)

1 pound powdered sugar3 tablespoons plain yogurt1/2 cup white chocolate chips1-pound cinnamon bears (chilled)



#### **Instructions:**

Combine cream cheese, confectioner's sugar and yogurt in microwavable bowl. Cook in microwave at medium power for 1 1/2 minutes. Remove from microwave and stir. Cook at medium power for an additional 1 1/2 minutes. Remove from microwave and stir white chocolate chips. Cook at medium power for 1 minute. Stir until smooth and creamy.

Treat Time: Stick a toothpick into cinnamon bears. Dip cinnamon bears in mixture until completely coated. Re-stir mixture if it starts to get too thick. Eat immediately or place on waxed paper and chill in refrigerator.
