Lesson Time

Lesson Summary:

Jeremiah was witness to the fulfillment of the Lord's warning that the Israelites would be brought into captivity and Jerusalem would be destroyed if they didn't keep their covenants. Still, Jeremiah taught the people of the Lord's everlasting love for them and His willingness to forgive if they repented. Even though the Israelites wouldn't listen, the Lord promised to again establish His covenant with the house of Israel in the future.

Jeremiah was cast into prison because of the wickedness of the people. Jeremiah asked a scribe named Baruch to write down his prophesies and read them at the temple. However, when the king heard the prophesies, he cut them up and burned them. The Lord told Jeremiah to again have Baruch write down his prophesies to preserve them. Eventually Jerusalem was destroyed and Jeremiah sadly wrote about how he felt about the wickedness of the people and their destruction in the book of Lamentations.

When we make covenants with God we promise to follow His commandments, and He promises us great blessings. When we keep our covenants He always keeps His promises. The Lord warns us of the consequences of breaking our covenants. He always loves us and wants us to repent so we can enjoy the blessings that come with covenant keeping.


Quote: "Anciently, the Lord blessed Father Abraham with a promise to make his posterity a chosen people. References to this covenant occur throughout the scriptures. Included were promises that the Son of God would come through Abraham's lineage, that certain lands would be inherited, that nations and kindreds of the earth would be blessed through his seed, and more. While some aspects of that covenant have already been fulfilled, the Book of Mormon teaches that this Abrahamic covenant will be fulfilled only in these latter days! It also emphasizes that we are among the covenant people of the Lord. Ours is the privilege to participate personally in the fulfillment of these promises. What an exciting time to live!" Russell M. Questions: What is a covenant?

How can we learn about the covenants and promises God has made? (In the scriptures.)Does God fulfill all his promises?How can we be better at keeping our covenants with God?How does keeping our covenants make us His people?

Activity Time

Description: Talk about the importance of covenants and having His law written in our hearts. Have each family member write or draw something in these paper heart frames that shows how they feel about the Savior. What you ■ A copy of the "Written in Our Hearts" artwork for each child, scissors, pencils or need: crayons **Preparation**: Print out artwork and cut out hearts. Read Jeremiah 31:31-34 and Jeremiah 32:38-41. Talk about the promises the Lord Activity: makes when we make covenants with Him. What laws do we promise to keep when we make covenants? What does it mean to have His law written in our hearts? Have each family member write or draw something that shows how they feel about the savior inside of the paper hearts. Display the paper hearts this week where you will see them often.



Treat Time

Prep Time:10 minutesBake Time:25-30 minutes

Ingredients: Heart mixture: 1/2 cup butter 1 teaspoon sugar 1/2 teaspoon salt 1 cup flour

Cream Filling: 2 cups Whipped Topping-thawed 1 teaspoon almond extract 4 large eggs

Raspberry Filling: 1 (21 oz.) can Raspberry Pie Filling

Instructions: Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Bring butter, sugar, salt and 1 cup of water to a boil in a saucepan. Stir in flour, and cook over medium-high heat, stirring constantly, for three minutes. Cool for 1 minute. Add eggs one at a time to the butter mixture, beating after each egg until smooth. Flatten dough to 2–3 inches thick. Cut into heart shapes. Bake on an ungreased baking sheet untill golden brown. Approximately for 25-30 minutes. Let cool. Slice each puff in half horizontally.

Treat Time: Give each family member a heart to fill with whipped cream and raspberries. Sprinkle tops with powdered sugar.

Filled Hearts
